The brainchild of journalist Marina Cantacuzino and photographer Brian Moody, and touring internationally under the auspices of the UK-based Forgiveness Project, “The F Word” tells vivid stories of people from around the world who, in the midst of violence, tragedy or injustice, demonstrate the power of forgiveness to transform hearts, lives, relationships and whole communities.

Cantacuzino secured stories of 24 people who had, in different ways, experienced tragedy and atrocity and who had chosen to move on in their lives through often painful and challenging journeys toward forgiveness.

The stories come from a variety of countries, including the United Kingdom, South Africa, Northern Ireland, Rwanda, Romania, Israel, the Palestinian territories and the United States.

The Forgiveness Project believes that by listening to the voices of people who have experienced reconciliation and renewal after trauma and unrest, it is possible to see alternatives to endless cycles of conflict, violence, crime and injustice
